

## Young Instrumentalist Prize 2021 Video Recording Guidelines

## RECORDING INFORMATION

- Your video recording will be assessed by a panel of QSO musicians and artistic staff to select six finalists for the Prize-winners Recital on Saturday 13 March.
- Please consider your recording as a performance.
- Before you begin your performance, please introduce yourself by stating your name, age, school, and then introduce the work you will be performing. Your stage presence will be considered by the audition panel. At the conclusion of your performance, you can bow and say 'thank you'.
- The performance can be between 8–10 minutes in duration (not including your spoken introduction), but it has a strict time limit of 10 minutes. Music performed beyond this time limit will not be considered.

## **RECORDING GUIDELINES**

- Dress code: please either wear your school uniform or smart casual clothes.
- Please record in an enclosed room with good lighting and with as little audio interference/background noise as possible. The camera should be sturdy (secure on a tripod, music stand, or flat surface). Please do not record with light shining directly behind you from a window or light.
- Videos must be recorded in landscape/horizontal position rather than in portrait, and should feature the majority of the applicant's body down towards their ankles, with a small amount of space above their head. The applicant must remain in view for the duration of the video.
- Check the audio quality before creating your final recording you want to ensure that the sound on the video is good quality at your softest and loudest dynamics.
- Each video must be in one continuous take, with no editing.

## **RECORDING SUBMISSION GUIDELINES**

- Please submit all videos and other files with the title format:
  - YIP\_Firstname\_Lastname\_Instrument.mp4 (other file formats will be accepted as well)

- Recordings must be submitted by <u>5pm on Monday 8 February 2021.</u>
